DIRECTOR'S LETTER

2023

2023 has seen a substantial period of growth for **Spectrum of Solutions.** After years of planning, fundraising, and construction, we moved into our new administration building in June. As the work continues around the property and on the playground, we have been excited to see things come together. Our new space has created an opportunity to implement systemic changes for the organization, helping to improve communication and delivery of our services.

We've been delighted to see great growth in the clients we support in both our adult and children's programs. Several children have reached their goals and "graduated" from therapy services at our Children's Therapy Center. Over 25 of our adult clients are currently employed in the community or within Spectrum of Solutions. We are thankful to our local foundations and corporate sponsors who helped ensure our clients had a variety of activities to attend this year including numerous Rockhounds baseball games, Special Olympics sporting events, sensory play dates, movie days, and more enrichment activities. Our clients also enjoyed the Love Without Limits Prom in February. We could not have accomplished these goals without the help of our dedicated volunteers, staff, and supporters.

In April, Spectrum of Solutions was elated to debut our new headlining gala event, Basin's Got Talent. At this gala evening, we hosted a treasure trove of incredibly talented individuals from across the Permian Basin to raise funds for the organization. In the summer, we enjoyed our annual Hope-in-One golf tournament. Our most recent fundraiser, the third annual Cruise for a Cause Car Show, was a great success. Held in October, Cruise for a Cause brought out an impressive variety of car show entries and we welcomed over 1,500 visitors to the event. 2024 will be a robust year of fundraising events where we expect to see growth with each event.

While the organization continues to navigate the post-pandemic staffing challenges, we celebrated the increase in funding for the waiver programs which Spectrum of Solutions provides. While the amount was not what was advocated for, the funds did allow the opportunity to increase the starting pay rate for direct care staff. Our staff and board members continue to provide testimony and communicate frequently with our legislators to advocate for the best care for individuals with Intellectual and developmental disabilities.

As our organization enters its 65 th year, we look forward to seeing what 2024 holds for Spectrum of Solutions. We will continue to move onward and upward in providing excellent care for the IDD community of the Permian Basin.

2023 has been a year of opportunity for Spectrum of Solutions. We moved into the new Anwar Family Inspiration Center building in the month of June. The Inspiration Park is still under construction, and we look forward to that new space in the upcoming months. The organization experienced growth and development across its programs this year, particularly in the accounting department. A software integration and new payroll system have allowed the organization to be more efficient and concise with financial reporting and daily operational tasks.

Spectrum of Solutions had an innovative and creative year in fundraising, debuting a new event, Basin's Got Talent. This new event brought in a wealth of talent from across the Permian Basin and proved to be a successful fundraiser for the organization. The annual Hope-in-One golf tournament was held in August at Ranchland Hills Golf Club. We are thankful to the participants who helped ensure an exciting and competitive day. Lastly, our 3 rd Annual Cruise for a Cause Car Show was a huge success. We exceeded our goal, hosting over 130 car enthusiasts, in addition to over 1500 attendees. We are appreciative of the partnerships with this event including the Permian Basin Corvette Club. We look forward to seeing the growth of this event in the upcoming years. Our final fundraising campaign for 2023 is the End-of-Year campaign. We encourage donors, foundations, and corporations to continue their giving to complete the holiday season.



Spectrum of Solutions has demonstrated leadership in advocacy in Austin this year. Staff, families, and board members have made numerous calls, sent letters and emails, and provided testimony to legislators during the 88 th legislative session. We celebrated the success of an increase in reimbursement rate, to benefit pay of direct support professionals. We will continue to advocate at a local, state, and national level to ensure the best care and support is provided to the clients we serve

The organization has been presented with a variety of challenges this year including staffing shortages, unexpected construction delays, and new mandates and rules required by Health and Human Services Commission. Despite these challenges, the organization showed resiliency and determination to overcome those adversities. We are grateful to our supporters who have assisted financially, provided encouragement, and volunteered. This support has ensured our clients have been given opportunities to thrive in our community

Spectrum of Solutions has had an incredibly successful year with the help of the 2023 Board of Directors. This group has held the organization to high standards, cast a vision for future success, and demonstrated compassion and care by volunteering with our clients, serving at fundraising events, and providing support to the management team.
